


Fans of excitement are invited to the shooting range



Monastic complex of the Cistercian abbey in Gościków-Paradyż







It is the largest and best-preserved monastic foundation in the Lubuskie region. Construction of the church began at the end of the 13th century. The present shape of the church and monastery is the result of a late Baroque reconstruction based on the original spatial layout. The oriented church is a basilica with a so-called bonded layout. The church is furnished with Baroque altars and Classicist stalls. Of exceptional artistic value is the main altar from 1739, which occupies the entire presbytery wall and was created by Saxon sculptors.



Joannites Castle in Łagów



Joannites Castle is undoubtedly a major tourist attraction. Restored, it is now a compact hotel and restaurant complex with a unique character. The main nave with its wide staircase leads directly into the glass-roofed Renaissance-Baroque courtyard, which is the soul of the castle. Specially adapted and decorated with abundant green vines, it now serves as a restaurant hall. It is also worth climbing to the top of the castle tower, from where you can admire the beautiful panorama of Łagów, the lakes and surrounding forests.

Kęszyca Leśna ghost village





A cobbled road among trees, tracks appearing and disappearing under layers of earth and windswept grasses. Platforms disappearing in bushes. This is how visitors are greeted by Kęszyca Leśna - a military Polish ghost town. After a few minutes' walk, the eye sees rows of several-storey houses standing at equal distances from the road. The construction of Kęszyca Leśna, or more precisely the military base located there, dates back to 1927. It was not without reason that, like many such complexes, it was located in the middle of the forest; it was to be a Wermacht complex. Already at the time of its construction, this huge complex was intriguing and frightening. No one fully knew what was going on there. Everything was strictly secret. The area was closed off and well guarded not only from the land.

The airspace above it was also off-limits. Multi-storey shelters, fortified sites grew on the huge construction site, and a railway was said to be running in the underground. Between 1956 and 1993, under an agreement between the governments of the Polish People's Republic and the USSR, the barracks were taken over for temporary use by the Soviet Army. We recommend parking the car and walking around the area or riding bikes there. The atmosphere is unique, and the last 100 years have resulted in abandoned blocks of flats and barracks standing here instead of forest.




City of Lubniewice




Lubniewice is a picturesque small town, located on three lakes: Lubiąż, Krajnik and Lubniewsko, which offer opportunities for swimming, fishing and water sports. The architecture of Lubniewice is mainly 19th and 20th century buildings, including charming tenement houses and the historic castle of the Lubomirski Dukes in the Neo-Renaissance style, which is one of the biggest tourist attractions. This castle is surrounded by a park with numerous alleys, ideal for walks. Lubniewice is called 'the city of love'. There is a Love Park here, as well as a Bridge of Love, which were created in honour of the doctor and sexologist, as well as the author of 'The Art of Loving', Michalina Wisłocka. Lubikowskie Lake is one of the most beautiful lakes in Lubuskie region. Surveys in 2016 classified the lake's waters as having a very good ecological status, which corresponds to quality class I. The lake's water transparency is 672.5 cm, which is one of the highest indicators in Poland




Something for wine connoisseurs




